Interactive Light Experience

Welcome to the Interactive Light Experience! Please note that you will be entering a darkened room, so it will take some time for your eyes to adjust. If you have questions the artist is available at the exhibit.



You will encounter a number of viewing stations. Each station is set up for you to manipulate the light in each environment with the use of switches, buttons, and controllers.


Mounted on each viewing station is a sign that explains the type of light manipulation you should experience as you interact with each station. To see this sign a small flashlight is provided at each station.

Each station explores one or more of the three ways that light can be manipulated.

Transmission: the mechanism by which light is moved through a material.

Reflection: the throwing back of the light off of a surface.

Absorption: the part of the visible light spectrum that is not reflected.



About the Artist Ross Brown

As a sculptor I have four elements I can manipulate: mass, space, time and light.

Mass: volumetric form

Space: the distance between things **Time:** making things that move, kinetics

Light: this is what illuminates the other three, but can also be a primary element in the

work.

I became interested in using light as my primary element in my work after taking a course on Stage Light Design at the University of Washington in 1978 when I was a graduate student in Sculpture. For my graduate thesis project, I created a theater environment using small theatrical lighting that was automatically controlled.

Over the past 50+ years as an artist I have started and operated two businesses, a leather business in the late 60's early 70's where we designed and manufactured custom leather goods and a decorative hardware business creating custom cast door and cabinet hardware for 18 years.

I have also taught metal casting and welding at Pratt Fine Art Center, at the University of Washington, and at Bellevue College.

My work has been exhibited in a number of galleries over the years with a show in New York City in 1992, a number of shows in Seattle, and 25 yeas showing at the Shidoni Gallery in Sant Fe, NM.

Thanks to the City of Sequim and the Clallam County PUD, I am pleased to be able to share my explorations into light with you.
